Sometimes misinformation goes out from people who are not involved in the band program, you're much more likely to get accurate answers straight from the source!

One of the truly enjoyable things about TJ is that the school offers a fully comprehensive high school experience along with the additional science and tech courses. It is very rare that a school with this academic reputation would also boast one of the best fine arts departments in the country. While you enjoy taking accelerated STEM classes, you also can take up to four years of band in one of the premiere programs in the US. In the TJ band program, there are many opportunities for you to perform and enjoy making music with your peers. The first step toward this process is signing up for band as a freshman. The other performing groups (Marching Colonials, Indoor Drum Line, Indoor Color Guard, Jazz Ensemble) are all dependent on that first step. There are certain situations later on down the road where you may take a year off from curricular band and still participate in the co-curricular groups, but as a freshman we do ask that you sign up for the class. We're well aware that it can be daunting to consider all the options and requirements ahead of you, but there are many ways students have to make the scheduling work the way they want it to in order to manage their course options the way they want to. This includes summer school options like Computer Science or PE (among many others), but the best way to learn what might work best for you is to talk with those students above who have experience with it.

When you sign up for band through registration it will place you in a generic "band" holding class. You will then be sorted into the specific ensemble that works best for you and the group. The ensembles that meet as a class are:

Percussion Ensemble (Upper Level Percussion Group) Symphonic Percussion (Second Level Percussion Group – We Accept Beginners Here!) Symphonic Band (Second Level Winds Group) Wind Ensemble [SWE] (Upper Level Winds Group) Jazz Band (8th period club open to all, plus a separate after school Jazz Ensemble, auditioned later in the year)

All of the above, except Jazz Band, count as the same "Advanced Band" credit on your transcript.

Preparing and submitting an evaluation or audition recording:

All incoming band students with a Fairfax County student ID are asked to join Google Classroom code: **o3xu6rz**

Evaluation/Audition videos may be submitted to the corresponding assignment posted in that Classroom.

All those coming from outside of Fairfax county who may not have their ID yet will not have access to the Google Classroom just yet. Videos may be submitted simply by emailing a link directly to <u>swballard@fcps.edu</u>. Please make sure you include your full name, and if possible, please send me LINKS to your videos rather than attachments.

There are two paths you can follow here - either a "Playing Evaluation" or a "SWE/Percussion Ensemble Audition". Incoming freshmen should focus on submitting the playing evaluation. Submitting the audition for the upper ensembles is optional and may take the place of the evaluation if you feel it will showcase your best skills. If you submit a playing evaluation and it indicates potential readiness, you may be invited to do the upper ensemble audition separately later on. Neither will be graded or shared with other students.

I will post some basic feedback and your ensemble placement in the private comments on your submission. Non-FCPS students who email me links directly will have feedback emailed directly back to them.

A single recording with all elements performed in succession is recommended but not required. If you prefer, you may submit each element below as an individual recording. Limit editing to captioning (recommended) and cuts while *not* playing. Test your audio and video recording *before* you make your final recording to ensure proper quality. But when you start recording for real, very often the first take is the best take, so go for it and don't let little mistakes stop you!

All submissions must be *video with audio*, with full view of your face, playing technique, and instrument. Contact me asap if you are unable to meet this expectation. For percussion, this includes your hands, wrists, and arms, as well as the playing surfaces of your instrument. A slightly elevated camera angled downward at the instrument works well, but keep your face in view as well for identification. Whatever instrument you have available to you is fine, even if it's not a concert snare or full-sized keyboard (octave transpositions are indicated on the Perc Ens mallet prepared piece if necessary).

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Submitting videos of any kind is optional, but strongly recommended.

If no video is submitted, students will be automatically placed into Symphonic Band/Percussion.

What are my chances of making one of the higher ensembles?

It depends on far too many factors to list. The short answer is that we typically only accept a few freshmen in the higher level groups a year, but it can fluctuate. We fill the groups up with the most qualified candidates for the positions. In the end, all students end up being enrolled in *Advanced Band*, so your transcript will look the same either way (if that worries you). Have confidence that we do what is best for the program and for you as a player (but we don't put the needs of an individual ahead of the group). We are very fortunate to get many talented players to join. Remember that you are auditioning for spots against upperclassmen who were just as talented as you when they first came in the program! But it's also worth noting, of our many All-District and All-Virginia Band honorees, most began their journey at TJ in the Symphonic Band; in fact some of our Symphonic Band members are included among those honorees this year! You will get a high level, quality experience no matter which ensemble you step into.

<u>I don't think I have as much experience on my instrument as others. Should I still join band</u> <u>even if I think I may be a little behind?</u>

Absolutely! There is a place for all ability levels in our program, including beginners. Band is a class where you can enjoy playing your instrument and improving. It doesn't matter what your ability level is when you enter the program. Our focus is simply on having you continue to get better each year, in competition with *no one* but yourself and your own personal annual goals.

When will I know the results?

Please allow some time for results, possibly several weeks or more. Usually we can give a fairly specific date (typically in mid-May), but with this unusual year have come some delays in the process. The best bet is to just know we will post them as soon as we can. In any case, there are a lot of auditions to get through for both incoming students and returning students, and there are lots of considerations when placing students into the appropriate ensembles. You will receive a message directly on your video assignment submission in Google Classroom (which should forward as an email to your fcps email) with feedback and your ensemble assignment for the coming school year. Those without an FCPS ID yet will be emailed that feedback directly.

TJ Bands Info and FAQ

The TJ Band Program is Comprehensive:

- 4 curricular ensembles: Symphonic Wind Ensemble, Symphonic Band, Percussion Ensemble and Symphonic Percussion. Jazz Ensemble offered extracurricularly.
- Fall, Winter, Pre-Festival, and Spring concerts, and year-end Jazz Cabaret.
- Weekly Jazz Band 8th period lab group open to any student interested in learning about jazz.
- Marching Band (TJMC) with full local and regional competition schedule.
- Winter Drum Line and Color Guard with local, regional, and national level competition schedules.

The TJ Band Program is Successful:

- TJ is a consistent Virginia Honor Band for superior ratings in marching band and concert band.
- Symphonic Wind Ensemble was featured at the 2013 and 2017 National Concert Band Festival as one of the premiere concert groups in the country. SWE was also selected to perform at the 2014 and 2019 VMEA State Conference.
- TJMC has won their class at the JMU Parade of Champions each of the past 5 times they have attended.
- TJMC is a Bands of America Regional Finalist most recently in 2017, 2018 and 2019.
- 29 TJ students were accepted into the 2021 District XI Symphonic and Concert Bands.
- 11 band students were selected to the 2021 All-Virginia Band and Orchestra Virtual Event, with 3 more as alternates. TJ had the most selected musicians of any school in the state.
- The TJ Winter Drum Line was the 2020 WGI Virginia Regional A-Class Champion, AIA A-Class Champion in 2015, 2017 and 2018, and a WGI World Championship Finalist in 2010.

The TJ Band Program is Well Supported:

- TJ Band Program is fully integrated into the TJ music program, collaborating with the orchestra, choral, and drama programs at school events.
- The students take responsibility for developing *esprit de corps*, organizing their sections, and participating in fundraising to support the program with a highly active Student Band Council.
- TJ Band Boosters is an active parent organization with dedicated volunteers and solid financial footing to support all band activities.

How different is the TJ program from my base school?

It is the same! The TJ program is completely comprehensive and offers every opportunity that you would be afforded at your base school. Every ensemble is of the highest quality, and you will have the same great experiences and memories that you would have in any band program in the northern VA area.

How do I sign up?

To enroll in the TJ band program, you simply need to select Band as your primary choice for elective in the fall. All incoming students need to do a placement session. Students are placed in the Symphonic Band by default, and also may audition for a spot in the Wind Ensemble (separate excerpt required). Both of these ensembles will be listed as Advanced Band on your schedule, and will satisfy your TJ Diploma Fine Arts credit during your first year of band. Audition info is in another document on <u>tibands.org</u> – video submissions will likely need to happen with the unusual circumstances this year, more details later.

What about marching band?

TJMC (Thomas Jefferson Marching Colonials) usually runs during the fall months and is the most visible ensemble in the school. Due to the cancellation of the Fall 2020 season, TJMC is actually running a SPRING exhibition mini-season in 2021! So we're still very much active. We have a final in-uniform performance on Saturday, May 1 in the TJ stadium at 3:15 PM if you'd like to see it and come ask questions in person. (Given current audience capacity allowances, we do not anticipate issues with number of people attending.)

Usually we perform all across the east coast throughout the fall, and have enjoyed great success in recent years. All winds and percussion must be signed up for curricular band. Color guard members do not have to be enrolled in band. Even if you do not play an instrument that typically marches outside (oboe, bassoon, or any non-band instrument) there is always a spot open somewhere in the ensemble for you. Orchestra and choir members are welcome! No marching experience is required for any member who wishes to join – all first year marchers are beginners at this! There will be much more info given out about TJMC once you have signed up for either the band course, or joined the color guard.

What if I don't currently play an instrument?

For students who are either beginners or just haven't played their instrument in several years, you will be placed in the symphonic band and given some targeted instruction to get you acclimated quickly and comfortably. You may also be asked to take private lessons with a specialist over the summer and/or during the school year so that you are better able to assimilate into the class. Please contact me directly at swballard@fcps.edu if you are in this situation. Exceptions may be made for beginning percussionists due to the nature of the class, which easily and typically accommodates beginners.

Can I try a different instrument at TJ?

If you are interested in switching to a new instrument, it is allowed solely based on the needs of the ensemble. In the recent past we have had saxophones switch from alto to another type, clarinets switch to bass clarinet and bassoon, and even a flute changing to tuba. The instrumentation of the band in the fall will determine the availability/necessity for switchers. Oboe and French horn are our most anticipated needs for 2021-22 but that is subject to change.

2021-2022 Thomas Jefferson HSST Band and Ensemble Fees

FCPS and the Thomas Jefferson HSST Band will not charge students a fee for any mandatory aspect of the Thomas Jefferson Band program except for musical instrument and course material fees which are permitted by the Virginia Department of Education regulations. Schools cannot require a student to pay fees for course materials in excess of the amount approved by the FCPS School Board in Notice 5922.

The following is a description of the Thomas Jefferson HSST High School Band course material fees and FCPS-sponsored optional activity fees for participation in the music program for the upcoming season.

FCPS Sponsored Optional Activity Fee

These are fees that students are expected to pay if they choose to participate in any optional activities/trips associated with the Thomas Jefferson HSST Band. This fee is determined and assessed based on the estimated cost of the trip/activity – including such costs as transportation, accommodation, registration, food, and other miscellaneous expenses.

Examples of trips/activities would include Marching Colonials, Indoor Winter Color Guard or Drum Line, and the Spring Trip.

Students who do not pay the fees associated with a trip/activity will be ineligible to perform/participate in the trip/activity.

Musical Instrument Rental Fee: This required fee only applies to students who play school-owned instruments, and covers maintenance costs of those school-owned instruments. Students who are verified to be on free/reduced meal plans will pay \$20 instead.

Marching Band Accessories: Certain uniform accessory items have to be purchased separately by the students as needed. Examples of these items include marching shoes, gloves, additional t-shirts, etc. The TJHSST Band will sell these items at cost to facilitate the ordering process.

Concert Uniform Accessories: Certain uniform accessory items have to be purchased separately by the students as needed. While certain concert uniform components are included (jacket, concert dress and faux pearl necklace), students are responsible for purchasing and maintaining their shirt (including stud buttons), pants, bow tie, cummerbund, black dress shoes, and black socks. Accessories will be between \$15 and \$50 depending on those needing to be purchased. The TJHSST Band will sell these items at cost to facilitate the ordering process.

Individual Performance Events: There are opportunities throughout the school year for individual students to choose to audition and/or participate in other bands. Examples include the All-District or All-State Band, and the Solo and Ensemble Festival. Audition or participation fees are often assessed for these opportunities by the sponsoring organization. The Thomas Jefferson HSST Band does not establish such fees, but the Thomas Jefferson HSST Band often assists in the collection of these fees from individuals who elect to participate and the submission of one group payment to the respective sponsoring organization. These fees are communicated at the time other information about these opportunities is communicated.

Payment Policies: Payments may be made via credit card, cash, or check as described below.

Credit Card (preferred)

o Credit Card payments are made through My School Bucks. We will send out a separate announcement and instructions for how to do this for those new to this system.

<u>Check</u>

- o Payments by check are made out to **TJHSST**. Please include the student's name and the fee being paid in the memo line of the check.
- o Payments made by check should be placed in the lockbox within the band room (to the right as you enter the front of the room)

<u>Cash</u>

<u>Please put the money in a sealed envelope and write the first and last name of the student and the</u>
<u>name of the fee being paid</u> (ex. Jane Doe, Marching Band fee), and take the envelope to the band office
before or after rehearsal. The TJHSST staff responsible for collecting such cash payments will give you a
receipt to acknowledge the cash payment. NO CASH PAYMENTS SHOULD BE DEPOSITED INTO THE
LOCKBOX IN THE BAND ROOM.

<u>Refunds</u>: Typically fees paid are non-refundable once commitments and purchases have been made. These refund policies will be communicated separately as they relate to individual activities.

<u>Financial Assistance</u> is available for those in need of such assistance. Requests for financial assistance should be made directly to the Band Director prior to the due date for the related fee. This money is provided by the TJHSST Band Boosters, and is covered by their fundraising efforts.
