What are Booster funds used for?

Booster funds pay for sectional coaches, leadership camps, equipment, uniforms, student scholarships, and other items that FCPS does not allow to be funded with student fees. Additionally, we sponsor fundraisers targeted for specialty instruments for use throughout the program. In past years, the TJ Band Program has been the grateful recipient of grants from the TJ Partnership Fund to replace several old instruments. Thank you, TJPF!

How do parents know what's going on in the band program?

- Your student - really. Information is given to students during their rehearsals or posted on *The Drive*. Student-led Band Council communicates through the closed (students only) Facebook page.

In a typical year... these are some of the helpers we need!

SWE/SB/Jazz Band/ Percussion Ensemble

For an evening with our concert ensembles, these people will have been hard at work behind the scenes:

- Volunteers to measure students for concert attire at the beginning of the school year, and to help make sure everyone has the full outfit on concert night;
- Coordinators to take a meal order for students, to be eaten after school and before the concert;
- Helpers to set up and monitor a table of refreshments for a post-concert reception;
- Food and drink contributions to fill that table;
- Volunteers to help sell spirit wear and answer questions.
- Shutterbugs to take photos!!

Marching Band

TJMC relies on volunteers for many things! When our season gets off the ground, we will need:

- Detail-oriented folks to help measure for, organize, distribute, and maintain uniforms;
- Construction experts to help design and assemble props;
- Shoppers to procure snacks, water, and other supplies;
- Chaperones to travel on buses with students and stay overnight with them at band camp, and for some of our more distant competitions;
- Rental truck drivers to transport our equipment and props;
- Safety experts to maintain the first-aid kits;
- Helpers to carry water to musicians and guard for warmups before football games;
- Assistants to help push props and large pit instruments on and off the field for performance;
- Parents comfortable behind the camera, to take photos!

Some of these jobs are one-task signups, while others are handled by season- or year-long leads. Try helping out for one event, to see if a coordinator position might be right for you?

TJDL/TJWG

Drumline and winter guard volunteers help with many of the tasks familiar to marching band helpers:

- Measure students for uniforms, and help alter outfits for performance.
- Drive equipment trucks, and help unload.
- Provide strong arms to help hustle equipment on and off the performance floor.
- Chaperone away trips, including some overnight stays.
- Take photos at performances!

And this is just the beginning! SRO, Jazz Cabaret, the Spring Band-Quet, and several student-planned events will also need our help. There's something to fit every schedule, and every talent!

A little bit more about our ensembles...

- Symphonic Band (SB) – Meets as a scheduled class during the school day, mostly underclassmen.
- Symphonic Percussion Ensemble – Meets as a scheduled class during the school day, split between one to two periods depending on enrollment, mostly underclassmen, also performs with Symphonic Band.
- Symphonic Wind Ensemble (SWE) – Placement by audition, meets as a scheduled class during the school day.
- Percussion Ensemble – Placement by audition, meets as a scheduled class during the school day, also performs with Symphonic Wind Ensemble.
- Jazz Ensemble – Placement by audition; meets after school; performs at school functions throughout a typical year, including band concerts, the Viennese Ball, Valentine’s Day Dance, and Jazz Cabaret.
- Jazz Band Club – Meets during one of the weekly 8th period blocks. Open to any TJ student who would like to explore this genre of music! Performs at Jazz Cabaret in June; Jazz Band NOT a prerequisite!
- TJ Marching Colonials (TJMC) – Marching band group (winds, percussion, color guard); rehearses during the summer and after school throughout the first quarter. Performs during halftime at home football games, and participates in marching band competitions on certain weekends during the season.
- Winter/Indoor Drum Line (TJDL) – Percussion group that incorporates artistic choreography in its performances; includes marching battery and stationary pit. Rehearses late fall through early spring, and participates in drum line competitions on certain weekends during the season.
- Winter/Indoor Color Guard (TJWG) – Color guard group that showcases flag and weapons talent in its choreography. Rehearses late fall through early spring, and participates in color guard competitions on certain weekends during the season.

Marching band and indoor drum line percussion decoded:

Pit – Stationary percussion instruments (e.g., marimba and keyboard), AKA “front ensemble.”

Battery – Marching percussion instruments (snare drums, tenors, and bass drums).
